About this Seminar:-

The financial crisis has emphasised the importance of insurance as a risk management tool in large scale construction projects. Contractors All Risks Policies, which are purchased as part of such construction projects, have been examined by the Courts in many jurisdictions in determining what loss and damage incurred in the life of a project is, and is not, covered by these policies. Mr. Justyn Jagger, who is currently the President of the Insurance Law Association of Singapore, will examine a number of decisions addressing the ambit of the insuring clause, the operation of the exclusion clauses, the importance of the notification clause and the increasing willingness of insurers to exercise their rights of subrogation. Mr. Jagger will conclude by summarising how contractors may avoid some of the common perils and pitfalls encountered when bringing an indemnity claim for loss and damage suffered during the project.
