

CHALLENGES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN EXTENSION OF TIME (EOT) PROTOCOL IN SINGAPORE

Friday 24th August 2007

The Talk:-

Construction projects frequently suffer from delays and are completed later than agreed by the contracting parties. Substantial financial claims can arise from these circumstances which invariably results in employers, contractors and subcontractors often arguing about the causes of and liability for the delayed circumstances. The Society of Construction Law (UK) has developed a delay and disruption protocol with the aim to provide a means by which contracting parties can resolve such matters and avoid unnecessary disputes.

This seminar examines some of the common issues of contention when assessing delay, with cross reference to the practical guidelines offered by the SCL (UK), concluding with discussion on the challenges faced in its potential implementation here in Singapore.

The Speaker:-

Dr Tony Farrow (BSc, MSc, PhD, Dip Arb, FRICS, FCIArb, FAE) - Managing Director, Trett Consulting

Tony Farrow trained as a Chartered Quantity Surveyor. Throughout his 30 year career, he has been closely involved in the preparation, analysis and negotiation of claims. His main professional activities include acting as an expert in international arbitrations. He has undertaken extension of time analysis on major power generation schemes, infrastructure projects and process industry plants including offshore structures, utilising techniques such as critical path analysis, snap shot analysis and as-built reconstruction. Dr Farrow's international experience includes living in Japan, the Oman and the Netherlands and has worked in Australia, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Kuwait, Egypt, Nigeria, and South Africa as well as throughout mainland Europe. He was involved in pioneering work with respect to the productivity implications when construction projects are accelerated. Dr Farrow is a Visiting Fellow at Western Sydney University.
